

Lutheran World Relief - 2023 SES LWR Quilt & Kit Report by Janice Hawkins, LWR Key Leader

Another successful collection occurred at all of our seven Ingathering locations in August. Southeastern Synod donations are still a little below pre-pandemic numbers but donations of Quilts & Kits continue to rise. The totals for the SES August 2023 collection were:

Quilts: 3189

Personal Care Kits: 2690

School Kits: 3235Baby Care Kits: 1001

Fabric Kits: 226

Total weight of all items: 28,682 pounds

Fifty-six churches came to the locations – seven were non-ELCA and three were from outside the boundaries of the Southeastern Synod. Ingathering locations are updated every spring and listed on the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) website. Locations are available to anyone who wants to drop off their donations. LWR does pay for the trucks to come to our sites and then deliver our donations to their warehouse in Maryland, so it is important that you and/or your congregational unit send a donation for the shipping fund to the WELCA treasurer.

Many thanks are extended to the site coordinators and volunteers who load the trucks at the Ingathering sites. It takes time and effort to gather up volunteers and load our donations into the trucks in the August heat! Thank you so much to these awesome women: Mary Jane Gray, Tommie Morgan, Joni Donegan, Roberta Stamp, Sandy Gibson, and Rhonda Gaede.

With all the conflict going on in the world right now, our donations are needed. LWR Quilts & Kits are some of the first items brought into these areas. Personal Care Kits and Baby Care Kits provide items for hygiene and family care. School Kits provide supplies for children to continue with a sense of normalcy as they gather for learning. This is the time of year to start working with your congregations and community groups to put together kits and of course, continue making quilts. Many times youth, Scouts, and school groups are looking for service projects. WELCA is the perfect resource to offer guidance for these groups. Be sure your pastors know that WELCA women are willing to help with these projects!

An updated Quilt & Kit Ministry Guide is expected to be available in January 2024. You can order multiple copies for free from the LWR website or by phone. These resources should be made available at your churches, cluster meetings, and for any group wanting to do a service project!

LWR is also developing a new Quilt & Kit tracker. It is hoped that information about the release of the new system will be reported in the next edition of The Weaver.

2023 Triennial Highlights

The Southeastern Synod Women of the ELCA sent a delegation of five voting members and two volunteers to the 12th Triennial Convention in September 19-21 in Phoenix, Arizona. The convention is the highest legislative authority in Women of the ELCA. Voting members from 64 synodical organizations conducted the business of our organization electing leaders for the next triennium, acting on memorials from synodical organizations, approving the budget, and much more.

For Our Congregational Units We Are Circles of Friends

In many of our Congregational Units (CUs), we have Circles, often named for women in the Bible. I love the concept of a circle for our WELCA gatherings. To me a circle has the ability to grow, change, and still be a circle. That's what I see for WELCA Circles: no minimum number of members, options on leadership styles, no "one size fits all". We can meet for Bible study, to do a service project, to tie quilts or assemble Lutheran World Relief (LWR) kits, or any number of other reasons.

Often our meetings are around a table—in a church classroom, in someone's living room, in a restaurant, or in a park. It doesn't matter where or why. At some point in time, we encourage and support each other, we pray together, we plan events, or how to help a local service organization. How does your Circle meet? Does it welcome newcomers? Has it changed over the years or remained the same? Is it open to change?

We often talk about encouraging younger women to participate, but what do they see when they look at our Circles? I see the same love, support, and encouragement I saw when my mom, my aunts, and grandmother gathered around my grandmother's kitchen table. There was love, laughter, and sometimes tears as they shared what was happening in their families. It was an honor to be invited to sit at the table with this amazing group of women. They taught me my first stewardship lesson: that even if I don't have a lot to give, when I share my little bit with others, it can make a difference in someone's life.

As a young mother, I was often given advice on raising children, sometimes unsolicited, but given out of love. When my oldest was ready to enlist in the Air Force, my mom couldn't understand why I cried every time I thought about it, and I still remember one of my aunt's reaching across the table, taking my hand, and saying "I understand". In WELCA, I have found that same encouragement, support, love, understanding, and willingness to share whatever they can that I experienced around that kitchen table years ago. I truly believe that women of all ages need that and can find a place in our Circles, around our tables. We just need to let them know that our Circles can be a place where they are welcomed, encouraged to grow in faith, supported, and become a "Circle of Friendship".

Some year's ago, someone shared the following about "A Circle of Friendship" that does a great job of describing our WELCA Circles. May we all find this friendship in WELCA.
